

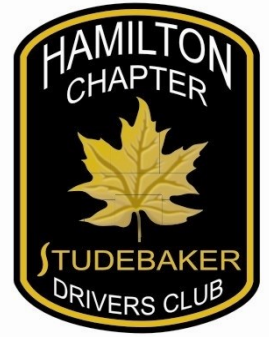

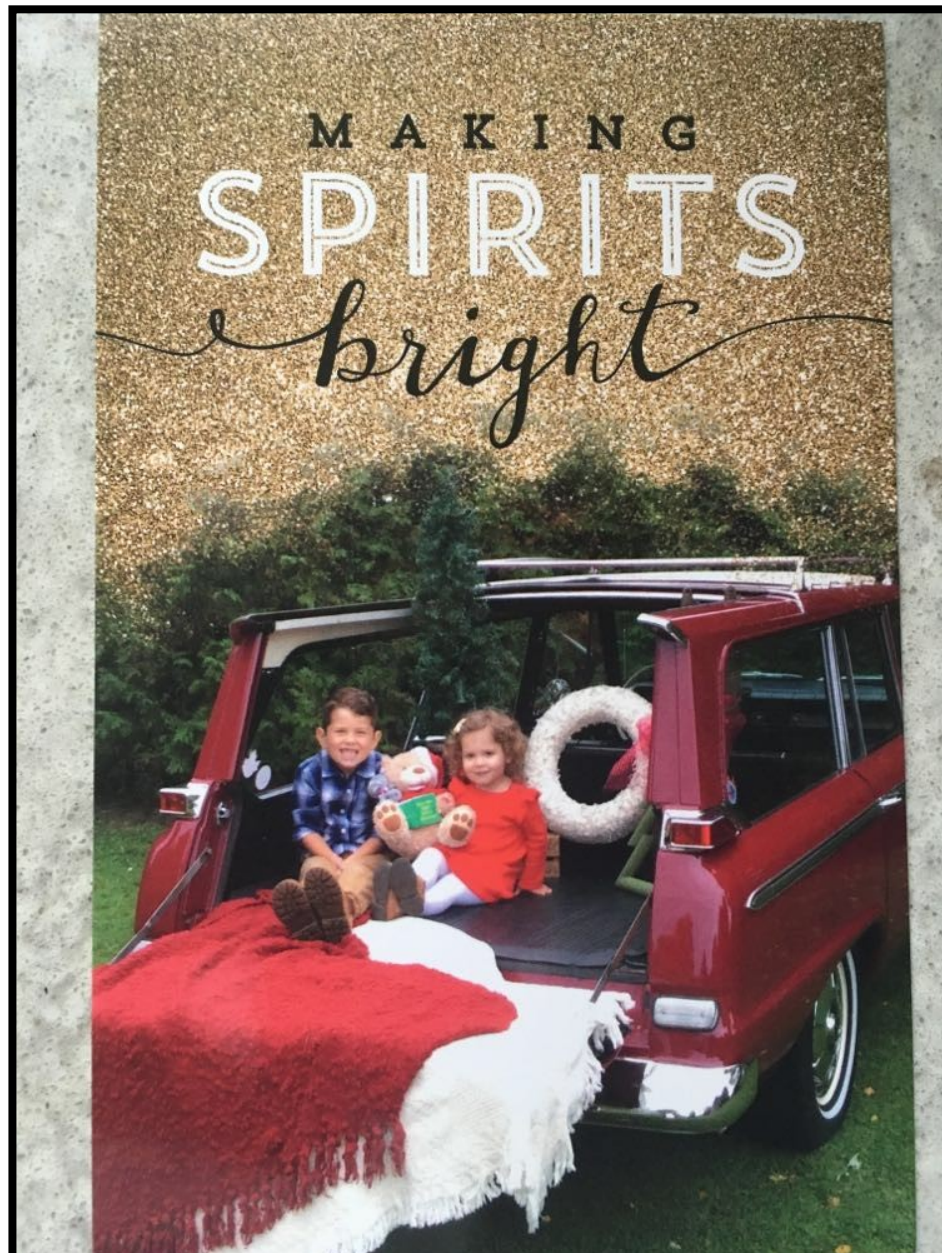

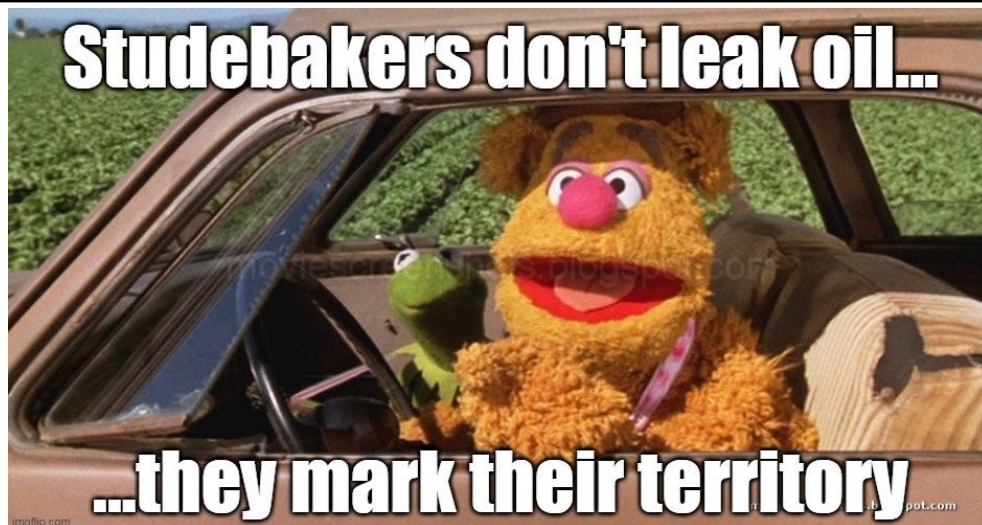
We were able to rededicate the plaque which is pictured here as it had been vandalized and had to be replaced.

On any given week, cruise night includes a wide variety of classic and unique vehicles. Held weather permitting, the event includes the Ancaster Optimist food truck, with proceeds benefiting the Ancaster Optimist Youth Work and Community Services. Cruise night is

free to attend.

Avid classic car collector Al Lambert of Mount Hope visited cruise night Aug. 8 with his 1931 McLaughlin-Buick. The vehicle features a Canadian-made chassis and engine.

Lambert also makes a living in the classic car field with his Hamilton-based business, Gasket City.

"We provide obsolete gaskets from the early 1900s to the late '70s," Lambert noted.

In addition to car gaskets, Gasket City provides hard-to-find parts for trucks, tractors, industrial and inboard marine units.

Lambert said his McLaughlin-Buick is noteworthy for its wood frame.

"You'll see very few that are of this vintage," said Lambert, who noted steel frames became the industry standard by the mid-1930s.

Steve Porter brought his 1958 Studebaker Commander to cruise night on Aug. 8.

Studebaker has a storied history in Hamilton, as Porter is well aware in his role as vice-president of the Studebaker Drivers Club of Hamilton.

Porter's 1958 Commander was made in South Bend, Ind. He also owns a Hamilton-made 1950 model and recently acquired a 1960 Studebaker as well.

"It's an interesting car," said Porter, who recalls memories of a Studebaker his wife's grandfather once owned.

Studebakers were manufactured in Hamilton until 1966, Porter noted.

"WOW, A LARKETTE, JUST WHAT I WANTED FOR CHRISTMAS"!

WHAT'S A LARKETTE?

You are probably asking yourself "what is a Larkette". No, it isn't a pedal car like most would think in looking at it in the photo above. It is actually a miniature Lark for children (and some adults) to enjoy just like Mom or Dad's full size Lark.

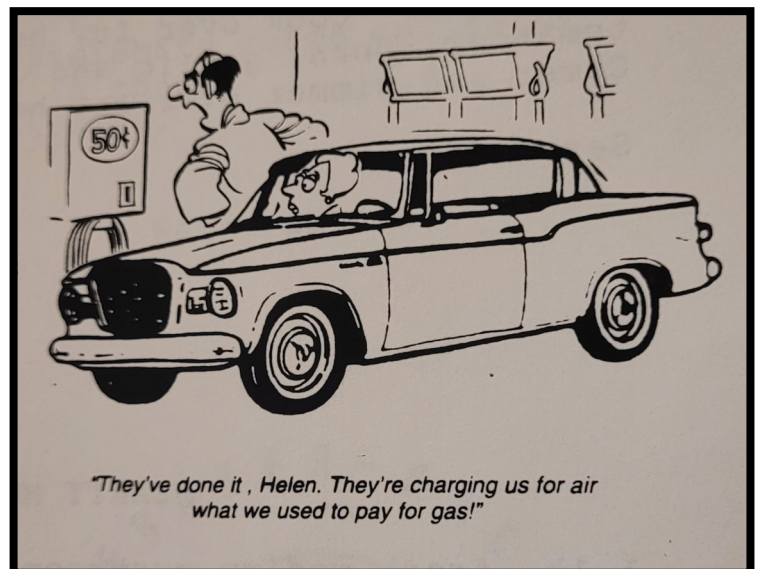
The Larkette, was often used by Studebaker dealers as a promotional device in the early 1960's. Some were given away as a promotion to come into the dealerships and take a new Lark for a demonstration ride and also register for the Larkette give away. Some ads even stated you didn't have to buy anything, just take a demonstration ride and you could enter to win. I found one ad that called it Larkette "Midget Car". I don't believe that would be acceptable in this day to advertise this way, but this was back in the 1960's. Things are different today.

THE LARKETTE

In 1959 Sam Schpok of Dowagiac, Michigan wrote to the Studebaker-Packard Corp with the hopes of producing a miniaturized Lark and Mercedes-Benz convertible for children to enjoy. He got his answer some six months later and within weeks, the Larkette was born. You could buy a plain Jane (\$236) or deluxe model (\$330) with a gasoline engine or electric powered. The body was fiberglass and it reached speeds of up to 25 mph. Schpok and his company, Master Enterprises, Inc in Eau Claire, Michigan manufactured about 1,000 Larkettes. Before that his production workers built gas grills, electric starters for lawn mowers, and a children's version of the Jeep, called the "Beep".

These Larkettes were used as giveaways at dealerships to help drive car sales. It was a great way to get folks in the dealerships to see the new Larks. If they brought their kids in, of course they would make a big deal about wanting the Larkette so they would have a car just like Mom or Dads.

There is an original blue Larkette in the Studebaker National Museum that Sam donated and was refurbished by Jim Geary some years go.

Of course you will find replica Larkettes out there for sale, but probably not to many of the originals available for sale.

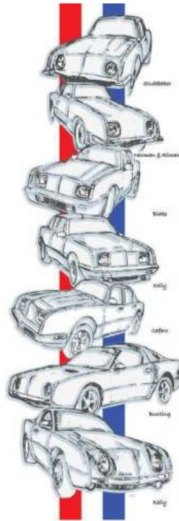
