

Canadian Employees See Partnership of Faith

At a company gathering Feb. 17 Studebaker Canada had its first general showing of the Studebaker film, "Partnership of Faith." D. C. Gaskin, vice president and general manager of the Canadian company, gave the historical background of Studebaker's development in the United States and in Canada.

The film stressed the inter-dependence of employees, stockholders and dealers, and pointed out that the welfare of all three depended upon the quality of cars produced. For those who joined the company since the last big gathering of Canadian employees it was an introduction to the story of Studebaker's rise from blacksmith shop to automobile corporation. The film gave a new appreciation of the size and complexity of our operations and of the importance of our individual contributions.

A feature of the evening was the presentation of employee entertainers. R. A. Willson, personnel manager, introduced the program and L. A. Corn, chief inspector, was master of ceremonies. In informal style, sixteen fine performers presented a variety of musical and humorous acts which helped make the evening a pleasant one.
