



He was really happy that we were Canadians (we can send auto parts to Cubans - but Americans can't because of the U.S. embargo, is my understanding). 
# NEVADA REVEALS THE PONDEROSA AND A STUDEBAKER INTEREST ......by Paul

#### WORKING AT THE HAMILTON STUDEBAKER PLANT

### HAMILTON CHAPTER MEMBER LOU SAUNDERS' WITH HIS STUDEBAKER MEMOIRS

My name is Lou Saunders and I was employed at the Hamilton Studebaker factory office from 1963 to its closing in 1966.

My job was in the factory office, salaried. I worked both with hourly workers as well as management. As a result I was witness to a number of happenings during my term of employment.

I would first like to comment on the closing of the plant. In the Fall of 1965 a person in the main office told me that the last vehicle would be built in the Spring of the next year. Our plant was an assembly operation. We did not manufacture anything and we had to rely on all parts coming in from all over. Because of the complexity of some parts a long lead time was required. In this case, an employee of Budd, located in Kitchener, which manufactured frames for us, mentioned that the order was being terminated as of the following Spring. I worked for the manufacturing manager, who was also a friend, and he confirmed to me that the rumor was true. I stared to look for a job and my first attempt was an interview with near-by Westinghouse. The man who interviewed me asked why I wanted to leave Studebaker. I replied that the plant was closing in the Spring, he didn't believe me. A week after we shuttered the plant my wife told me that I had a call from somebody at Westinghouse. I declined to return the call.

#### SHIPPING CARS-

Originally, when I first started, cars shipped by rail were loaded inside the plant onto 40' rail cars called Evan cars. Two cars were loaded from the side facing each end. The rear of each was jacked up and two more cars were wedged in, tied down and with the door secured sent on their way.

The next invention was a two level boxcar that was loaded from the end and held six vehicles. My job was to plan which autos went in which rail car and to determine which rail station they were to go to. I had to place an order for the rail cars, prepare the shipping papers for the railroad and to deliver them to the railroad office on my way home. This was pretty straight forward, but, one day there were two rail cars carrying six cars each. One of these rail cars was destined for Winnipeg and the other for Quebec City. A few days later I was called into the office and told that I had reversed the shipments. The cost of shipping vehicles (and parts) was great. It was decided that the entire twelve cars would stay in the areas where they were inadvertently sent and allocated to local dealers and the entire order would be rebuilt and reshipped. I expected to be fired but luckily that did not happen, but, I was extremely careful from then on.

Sometime later came the introduction of the tri-level rail cars that are still in use today. These units hold fifteen autos each and have to be loaded outside. We were running two shifts by this time as well as shipping a few Mercedes across the country. In order to use this new technology a rail spur had to be built. When our inhouse engineer finished overseeing this construction a rail car was brought in and parked at the end of the loading ramp. The next morning we went to inspect the unit and it wasn't there. On its own it had decided to vacate the property. The rail line wasn't level and sloped away from the loading ramp sending the rail car down the slope. The line had to be rebuilt and Studebaker's in-house engineer had to find a new job.

I enjoyed my years at Studebaker Canada, Lou




